At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success:

- Set up a homework routine
- Read 20 minutes daily
- Review your child's classwork/homework
- Make sure your child has necessary supplies to complete assignments

- Provide healthy nutrition
- Provide activities for physical activity
- Limit TV and electronics
- Notice and praise the growth your child is making
