ERWC

ERWC stands for Expository Reading and Writing Curriculum. This is a college preparatory course focused on developing rhetorical thinking, speaking, listening, and writing skills. Throughout the year, the course will cover literary genres such as novels, poetry, short stories, plays, and non-fiction. The course writing will vary in purpose but include analytical, reflective, autobiographical, observational, and descriptive. Students will learn to develop their vocabulary, grammar, and critical thinking skills. Last, students will also be expected to participate in speaking and listening activities, including presentations.

Grades

Grades are assessed based off of classwork, homework, essays, assessments, and projects. Grades can be viewed on Google Classroom and Aries, but all final grades will be on Aries. Students need to hang onto all assignments until the end of the grading period just in case there is a discrepancy with final grades; a hard copy must be presented to the teacher to fix any discrepancies. Parents and students are recommended to contact me if there is any concern or confusion about a student's grades. The grade breakdown is as follows:

Homework/Classwork Policy

All homework is due the day after it is assigned unless otherwise specified in directions. Assignments will be posted onto Google Classroom for student reference, and they will also be turned in on Google Classroom. Accommodations will be made for students who are unable to follow this modal. Students who are absent or otherwise miss school are given an extension of one day for every day they've missed school. However, as all work is on google classroom, students are advised to keep up with work, so they do not fall behind. It is the student's responsibility to check google classroom and contact Mr. Harden to determine what work needs to be turned in. Major projects and Essays will need to be turned on or before the date it is due.

Classroom Discussion

Academic Dishonesty Policy

Technology
