



Right On Track guidance

Students are guided toward better behavior when they need to be corrected

- 1. Staff use the language of the expectations to guide students to better choices in behavior.
- Consequences may be given based on the level or frequency of behavior.
- 3. Parents receive communication about students needs for guidance for behavior that does not meet expectations.
