Read-Along Information (RI)	Now we are going to read together. Listen while I read. • Focus on basic facts, key details, and simple comprehension, using "who," "what," "where," "when," and "why" to guide the questioning. • What is this text mostly about? • What happens when? • What happens at the end of the text? Tip: Read aloud an informational passage while the student follows along, include pictures. Ask at least three questions about the passage. The answer choices may be pictures or text. Model using the language from the informational text.
