This matter is being considered in closed session pursuant to Government Code 54956.9, subdivision (d)(2) and (e)(5). Government Code 54956.9(e)(5), permits a closed session to discuss a "statement threatening litigation made by a person outside an open and public meeting on a specific matter within the responsibility of the legislative body so long as the official or employee of the local agency receiving knowledge of the threat makes a contemporaneous or other record of the statement prior to the meeting, which record shall be available for public inspection pursuant to Section 54957.5.

In the case of Fowler v. City of Lafayette (2020) 45 Cal.App.5th 68, the Court noted that when litigation has been threatened outside a public meeting, it may be discussed in closed session under Government Code section 54956.9(e)(5). However, the Court stated that a record of a litigation threat to be discussed in closed session must be included in the agenda packet made available upon request before a meeting. The Court concluded that, "read together, sections 54956.9, subdivision (e)(5) and 54957.5 require public agencies to include with the agenda materials litigation threats to be discussed in closed session." In compliance with this holding, the District includes in the agenda packet the demand.

Re: <u>Cease and Desist Brown Act Violations – September</u> 19, 2024, Board Meeting

Dear President Sonja Shaw and Members of the Board,

I write on behalf of Associated Chino Teachers, CTA/NEA ("ACT") and Natalie Cooney regarding the illegal conduct of the Chino Valley Unified School District ("CVUSD") Board of Education towards members of the public seeking to participate in a public meeting. During its September 19, 2024 Board meeting, CVUSD openly and repeatedly infringed on the public's legal right to comment on public matters before the Board, in violation of the Ralph M. Brown Act (Gov. Code § 54950 et seq.). CVUSD's actions also constitute violations of the First Amendment rights of individual members of the public to speak in a public forum. Pursuant to California Government Code § 54960.2, this letter serves as a formal demand that CVUSD cure its violations immediately by taking the specific remedial actions required by the Brown Act, outlined in further detail below. If CVUSD fails to take such remedial actions within 30 days, ACT and Ms. Cooney intend to pursue appropriate legal action.

At the September 19, 2024 Board meeting, CVUSD's Board discussed Agenda Item IV.A.1, which contained official notice of the proposed language for a new board policy titled the "No Deception" policy. This new policy language was proposed in response to a September 11, 2024 Superior Court permanent injunction issued against CVUSD at the request of the California Attorney General Rob Bonta. The permanent injunction required CVUSD to rescind a prior parental notification policy that was ruled unconstitutional and discriminatory, because it singled out district LGBTQ+ students for mandatory forced outing. CVUSD's "No Deception" policy includes alternate language for a new parental notification policy that would again effectively require the forced outing of district LGBTQ+ students.

During public comments on this agenda item, CVUSD's Board president Sonja Shaw and other Board members committed multiple Brown Act violations by 1) imposing unlawful content-based restrictions on public comments, 2) limiting speakers to discussing what Board members attempted to characterize as the "actual technical language" of the proposed policy, and 3) prohibiting any reference to the related court case, the permanent injunction, the district's prior discriminatory forced outing policies, and the potential unconstitutional and discriminatory impacts of the new policy. The Board's content-based restrictions on speech infringed on the rights of multiple speakers and violated the Brown Act's guarantee of transparency and public participation.

Specifically, a former District teacher, was interrupted when attempting to discuss the permanent injunction, and was warned about microphone muting if she addressed the legal matter. Although persisted and was able to finish her comments, President Shaw warned her and subsequent speakers that they were prohibited from speaking about the context related to the new policy.

Natalie Cooney, a current District teacher and ACT bargaining unit member, was repeatedly interrupted during her public comments with strident warnings by Board president Shaw and vice-president Monroe to stop discussing her concerns about the policy's harmful impacts on LGBTQ+ students, the permanent injunction, and prior illegal

CVUSD policies that would be continued in the new policy. Board president Shaw angrily muted Cooney's microphone, and then ordered that Cooney be ejected from the meeting for alleged disruption, even though Cooney caused no disruption whatsoever.

Former student was also prevented from addressing the policy's potential negative effects on LGBTQ+ students like her, and from sharing her experience as a former Gender and Sexuality Alliance president at Ayala High School. Shaw similarly interrupted her, rudely instructing her to limit her comments to the specific language of the policy. microphone was cut off, and her opportunity to speak was prematurely terminated.

These actions by the Board violated the Brown Act, which guarantees the public's right to comment on any agenda item before or during the item's consideration. Gov. Code § 54954.3(a). And even if the policy had not been on the agenda, the Brown Act guaranteed these speakers the right to comment on any item under the Board's jurisdiction — which of course includes the district's policies regarding LGBTQ+ students. Further, the Act prohibits content-based restrictions on public comments. Gov. Code § 54954.3(c).

The Board also violated the First Amendment by engaging in unconstitutional viewpoint discrimination, imposing illegal prior restraint of speech, and removing speakers for expressing dissent rather than actual disruption. The First Amendment protects the public's right to engage in broad criticism of government officials and policies in limited public forums, such as school board meetings. The courts have consistently held that restrictions on public comments that limit speech and prohibit criticisms of the Board's policies and acts are unconstitutional. See Baca v. Moreno Valley Unified School *District*, 936 F. Supp. 719 (C.D. Cal. 1996); *Leventhal v. Vista* Unified School District, 973 F. Supp. 951 (S.D. Cal. 1997) (overturning a board bylaw that prohibited criticism of school district employees); Acosta v. City of Costa Mesa, 718 F.3d 800 (9th Cir. 2013) (striking down a policy that unlawfully prohibited offensive or disagreeable speech that was not limited to prohibiting actual disruptions); 78 Ops. Cal. Atty. Gen. 224 (1995) ("[I]n adopting 'reasonable regulations' pursuant to subdivision (b) of section

54954.3, the legislative body must exercise care that the regulations themselves do not violate the public's freedom of expression by being too broad or constituting a 'prior restraint' on expression.")



Pursuant to Gov. Code § 54960.2, ACT demands the following corrective actions:

- Acknowledgment of the Brown Act Violation: The Board must acknowledge that its actions on September 19, 2024, violated the public's right to comment on matters under consideration by the legislative body and to engage in criticism of the "No Deception" policy.
- 2. Unconditional Commitment to Cease and Desist: The Board must issue an unconditional commitment to cease and desist from imposing content-based restrictions on public comments, in violation of the Brown Act and First Amendment rights. This includes guaranteeing that members of the public will be allowed to provide broader criticisms related to policy decisions without unlawful interference. The unconditional commitment to cease and desist must then be

approved in an open session of the Board as a separate item of business, not on its consent agenda.

3. Correction of Public Meeting Procedures: The Board must ensure that future public meetings comply with the Brown Act, particularly with respect to ensuring that public comments are not unlawfully restricted or muted based on content.

Failure to provide an unconditional commitment within 30 days from the receipt of this letter will result in legal action seeking appropriate injunctive and declaratory relief.

SUBJECT: REVISION OF BOARD BYLAW 9323—MEETING CONDUCT

BACKGROUND

Board policies, administrative regulations, and Bylaws of the Board are routinely developed and revised as a result of changes in law, mandates, federal regulations, and/or current practice. Board Bylaw 9323—Meeting Conduct is being revised in response to the Associated Chino Teachers' October 21, 2024 letter to the District, which states in part:

"CVUSD's Board president Sonja Shaw and other Board members committed multiple Brown Act violations by 1) imposing unlawful content-based restrictions on public comments, 2) limiting speakers to discussing what Board members attempted to characterize as the "actual technical language" of the proposed policy, and 3) prohibiting any reference to the related court case, the permanent injunction, the district's prior discriminatory forced outing policies, and the potential unconstitutional and discriminatory impacts of the new policy. The Board's content-based restrictions on speech infringed on the rights of multiple speakers and violated the Brown Act's guarantee of transparency and public participation."

In accordance with Government Code 54954.3 (b)(1), The legislative body of a local agency may adopt reasonable regulations to ensure that the intent of subdivision (a) is carried out, including, but not limited to, regulations limiting the total amount of time allocated for public testimony on particular issues and for each individual speaker. As such, and to further clarify, streamline public comments, and make clear to some members of the public who have incorrectly interpreted the Ralph M. Brown Act, revisions to Board Bylaw 9323—Meeting Conduct are recommended.

New language is provided in UPPER CASE while old language to be deleted is lined through.

Approval of this item supports the goals identified within the District's Strategic Plan.

RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended the Board of Education approve the revision of Board Bylaw 9323—Meeting Conduct.

FISCAL IMPACT

MEETING CONDUCT

Meeting Procedures

All Board of Education meetings shall begin on time and shall be guided by an agenda prepared in accordance with Board bylaws and posted and distributed in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act (open meeting requirements) and other applicable laws.

(cf. 9322 - Agenda/Meeting Materials)

The Board president shall conduct Board meetings in accordance with Board bylaws and procedures that enable the Board to efficiently consider issues and carry out the will of the majority.

(cf. 9121 - President)

The Board believes that late night meetings deter public participation, can affect the board's decision-making ability, and can be a burden to staff. Regular Board meetings shall be adjourned at 9:00 p.m. unless extended to a specific time determined by a majority of the Board. The meeting shall be extended no more than once and, if necessary, may subsequently be adjourned to a later date.

Quorum and Abstentions

The Board shall act by majority vote of all of the membership constituting the Board. (Education Code 35164)

(cf. 9323.2 - Actions by the Board)

The Board believes that when no conflict of interest requires abstention, its members have a duty to vote on issues before them. When a member abstains, his/her abstention shall not be counted for purposes of determining whether a majority of the membership of the Board has taken action.

(cf. 9270 - Conflict of Interest)

Public Participation

Members of the public are encouraged to attend Board meetings and to address the Board concerning any item on the agenda or within the Board's jurisdiction. So as not to inhibit public participation, persons attending Board meetings shall not be requested to sign in, complete a questionnaire, or otherwise provide their name or other information as a condition of attending the meeting, except that if the meeting is conducted using remote public participation or with a Board member attending remotely pursuant to Government

Code 54953, a member of the public desiring to provide comment through the use of a third-party internet website or online platform may be required to register as required by the third-party provider.

In order to conduct District business in an orderly and efficient manner, the Board requires that public presentations COMMENTS to the Board comply with the following procedures:

- 1. The Board shall give members of the public an opportunity to address the Board on any item ON THE AGENDA of interest to the public that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board, either before or during the Board's consideration of the item. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.3)
- 2. At a time so designated on the agenda at a regular meeting, members of the public may bring before the Board matters OF INTEREST that are not listed on the agenda BUT ARE WITHIN THE SUBJECT MATTER JURISDICTION OF THE BOARD. The Board shall take no action or discussion on any item not appearing on the posted agenda, except as authorized by law. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.2)
- 3. THE DESIGNATED OPPORTUNITIES LISTED IN PARAGRAPHS 1 AND 2 ABOVE SHALL BE CONSOLIDATED INTO A SINGLE PUBLIC COMMENT SESSION FOR EACH OPEN SESSION MEETING AND WILL BE LISTED ON EACH AGENDA.
- 34. Without taking action, Board members or District staff members may briefly respond to statements made or questions posed by the public about items not appearing on the agenda. Additionally, on their own initiative or in response to questions posed by the public, a Board or staff member may ask a question for clarification, make a brief announcement, or make a brief report on his/her own activities. (Government Code 54954.2)
 - Furthermore, the Board or a Board member may provide a reference to staff or other resources for factual information, ask staff to report back to the Board at a subsequent meeting concerning any matter, or take action directing staff to place a matter of business on a future agenda. (Government Code 54954.2)
- 45. The Board need not allow the public to speak on any item that has already been considered by a committee composed exclusively of Board members at a public meeting where the public had the opportunity to address the committee on that item. However, if the Board determines that the item has been substantially changed since the committee heard the item the Board shall provide an opportunity for the public to speak. (Government Code 54954.3)

(cf. 9130 - Board Committees)

56. A person wishing to be heard by the Board shall first be recognized by the president and shall then proceed to comment as briefly as the subject permits.

In general, individual speakers will be allowed up to three minutes to address the Board on each agenda or non-agenda item and the Board will limit. THE total time for public input on each item to 30 IS 60 minutes. A speaker may not use the podium THEIR TIME for purposes other than addressing the Board directly. If there are no further comments, a speaker will be considered to have relinquished his or her allotted three minutes TIME. SPEAKERS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO CEDE THEIR UNUSED TIME TO ANOTHER SPEAKER.

However, in exceptional circumstances when necessary to ensure full opportunity for public input, the Board president may, with Board consent, adjust the amount of time allowed for public input and/or the time allotted for each speaker. FOR EXAMPLE, TIME COULD BE ADJUSTED by the following ranges: 3-minutes per speaker for up to 18 speakers; 2-minutes per speaker for 19 – 30 speakers; and 1-minute per speaker for 31 plus speakers.

In order to ensure that non-English speakers receive the same opportunity to directly address the Board, any member of the public who utilizes a translator shall be provided at least twice the allotted time to address the Board, unless simultaneous translation equipment is used to allow the Board to hear the translated public testimony simultaneously. (Government Code 54954.3)

- 67. The Board president may rule on the appropriateness of a topic, subject to the following conditions:
 - a) If the topic would be more suitably addressed at a later time, the Board president may indicate the time and place when it should be presented;
 - b) The Board shall not prohibit public criticism of its policies, procedures, programs, services, acts, or omissions (Government Code 54954.3);
 - c) The Board shall not prohibit public criticism of District employees. However, whenever a member of the public initiates specific complaints or charges against an individual employee, the Board president shall inform the complainant of the appropriate complaint procedure.

(cf. 1312.1 - Complaints Concerning District Employees) (cf. 9321 - Closed Session Purposes and Agendas)

78. The Board president shall not permit actual disruption of Board meetings. Actual disruption by an individual or group or any conduct or statements that threaten the safety of any persons(s) at the meeting shall be grounds for the President to terminate the privilege of addressing the Board and remove the individual from the meeting.

The Board president or designee may remove an individual for actually disrupting the meeting. Prior to removal, the individual shall be warned that their behavior is disrupting the meeting and that failure to cease the disruptive behavior may result in removal. If, after being warned, the individual does not promptly cease the disruptive behavior, the Board President, or designee, may then remove the individual from the meeting. (Government Code 54957.9)

When an individual's behavior constitutes the use of force or a true threat of force, the individual shall be removed from a Board meeting without a warning. (Government Code 54957.95)

Disrupting means engaging in behavior during a Board meeting that actually disrupts, disturbs, impedes, or renders infeasible the orderly conduct of the meeting and includes, but is not limited to, a failure to comply with reasonable and lawful regulations adopted by a legislative body pursuant to section 54954.3 or any other law, or engaging in behavior that constitutes use of force or a true threat of force. (Government Code 54957.95)

True threat of force means a threat that has sufficient indicia of intent and seriousness, that a reasonable observer would perceive it to be an actual threat to use force by the person making the threat. (Government Code 54957.95)

Additionally, the Board may order the room cleared if necessary. In this case, members of the media not participating in the disturbance shall be allowed to remain, and individuals not participating in such disturbances may be allowed to remain at the discretion of the Board. When the room is ordered cleared due to a disturbance, further Board proceedings shall concern only matters appearing on the agenda. (Government Code 54957.9)

When disruptive conduct occurs, the Board may decide to recess the meeting to help restore order, or if removing the disruptive individual(s) or clearing the room is infeasible, move the meeting to another location. The Board may direct the Superintendent or designee to contact local law enforcement as necessary.

Recording by the Public

Members of the public may record an open Board meeting using an audio or video recorder, still or motion picture camera, cell phone, or other device, provided that the noise, illumination, or obstruction of view does not persistently disrupt the meeting. The Superintendent or designee may designate locations from which members of the public may make such recordings without causing a distraction.

(cf. 9324 - Board Minutes and Recordings)

If the Board finds that noise, illumination or obstruction of view related to these activities would persistently disrupt the proceedings; these activities shall be discontinued or restricted as determined by the Board. (Government Code 54953.5, 54953.6)

REMOVAL AND REPLACEMENT

BACKGROUND

Public Contract Code 20111 requires that contracts for public works exceeding \$15,000.00 be legally advertised and awarded to the lowest responsible bidder, who shall provide such bid security as the Board requires.

A Notice to Contractors Calling for Bids for Bid No. 24-25-01F, Chino HS Small Gym Floor Removal and Replacement, was published in the Inland Valley Daily Bulletin on September 23, 2024, and September 30, 2024. Bids were submitted at 1:00 p.m. on October 11, 2024.

The results are as follows:

Pro Flooring Corporation	\$496,800.00
Geary Floors, Inc.	\$528,000.00
Diamond Fitness Systems, Inc	\$572,145.00
Coastal Sports Flooring (Withdrawal)	\$525.00

The basic scope of work for this project is the demolition and removal of the old gym floor and installation a new floor in the recently refurbished small gym at Chino High School.

Approval of this item supports the goals identified within the District's Strategic Plan.

RECOMMENDATION
