PHYSICAL EDUCATION (P.E.)	20 credits	2 yrs
WORLD HISTORY	10 credits	1 yr

GOV'T & ECONOMICS	10 credits	1 yr
FINE ARTS or FOREIGN LANG or CTE	20 credits	2 yrs
HEALTH	5 credits	½ yr
ELECTIVES (may include: Math, Science, Language)	60 credits	

Required for graduation

= 225 credits

4 Graduation Requirements

1. Earn 225 credits (required core classes and electives).
2. Pass the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) in both Math and English (offered several times yearly).
3. Complete 3 different years of math.
4. Achieve a GPA of 2.0 or higher.



Alternative options for Credit Recovery

CVUSD - Adult School

- Basic, not College Prep
- Only 20 credits max
- Repeat Failed classes only
- Limited space – Seniors have priority



Summer School 2014 – for non-grads to complete credits. Diploma issued in summer after credits are completed. Normally F grades only.

Work Experience:

Must have a job to take this class

- Students earn variable elective credit (up to 10 credits per semester)

CREDIT RECOVERY

- CVUSD VIRTUAL PROGRAM

a limited number of online classes offered through the CVUSD District to make up credits.

Offered four times a year

- ROP

ROP offers career training opportunities .

Receive High School Elective credit and learn some specific skills.

Mt. San Antonio College High School Referral Program

- **Fall / Winter/ Spring/ Summer Sessions**
- **Meet 4 year college entrance requirements.
(make up D and F grades)**
- **Must have a parent and counselor signature on application.**

How to Choose a College

- The ideal match is a school that supports both intellectual and personal growth.
- Create an initial list of schools from a variety of sources.
 - Schools you've heard of
 - Family/friends/counselor suggestions
 - Matches on collegeboard.com or californiacolleges.edu
- Apply to 4 or more colleges
 - 1 or 2 long shots
 - 2 possible
 - 2 very likely
 - Don't limit to just well-known universities



Subject Requirement ("A-G" Courses)

- a. History/Social Science – 2 years (1 yr. US; 1 yr. World)
- b. English – 4 years
- c. Math – 3 years, at least thru Algebra II (4 years recommended)
- d. Lab Science – 2 years (3 years recommended)
 - Physical Science – Chemistry (UC); Earth Science (CSU)
 - Biological Sciences-1 yr Biology CP/Honors/AP
- e. Language Other Than English – 2 years of same language (3 years recommended)
- f. Visual and Performing Arts – 1 year (drama, art, dance, chorus, band)
- g. College Preparatory Elective – 1 year, Psych., Economics, 3rd yr. of foreign language, science, social science, etc.)

Students can check Counseling website for Ayala's "A-G" approved courses.

All classes must be college prep, honors or Advanced Placement

All Grades must be "C" or better!

- **Adds clarity, richness and meaning to application and completes the application.**
- **Enables applicant to make the best possible case for admission.**
- **An admission decision is never based on the content of the personal statement alone.**

Examination Requirement

- **Most 4-Year colleges and universities require the SAT Reasoning Test or the ACT exam with writing.**
- **Fairtest.org – list schools that do not require entrance tests.**
- **Some schools (UC's included) also recommend the SAT Subject area tests in two areas of your choice. Some of the SAT Subject Tests are: U.S. History, Math (level II), Chemistry, Physics, World History, Biology, German, Spanish, Literature, and others.**

PRIVATE COLLEGES

- Go online to find application, deadlines, admissions requirements, and financial aid requirements.
- Most colleges will use Commonapp.org or Sendedu.com to apply. Make sure to invite your recommenders on your application site.
- Most private colleges will ask for counselor/teacher recommendations. Give them ample time to write a good recommendation.
- Many private colleges have additional financial aid paperwork.

Community Colleges

- A great place to begin.
- Many schools have Honor Programs
- A financial bargain
- They offer certificate programs or an associate's degree (2 years of college)
- If you do well, transferring to other colleges is not a problem
