Shared Responsibility for Learning

In the Classroom

All teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in meeting or exceeding the CA Common Core State Standards. Some key ways to connect our classroom practices with the school goals will be to:

<u>GOAL 1</u>

Provide high quality curriculum and instruction aligned with the Common Core Standards for English Language Arts and Mathematics and engage students with the Standards for Mathematical Practices.

- 1. Make sense of problems and persevere in solving them.
- 2. Reason abstractly and quantitatively.
- 3. Construct viable arguments and critique the reasoning of others.
- 4. Model with mathematics.
- 5. Use appropriate tools strategically.
- 6. Attend to precision.
- 7. Look for and make use of structure.
- 8. Look for and express regularity in repeated reasoning.

<u>GOAL 2</u>

"Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe" are the essentials of our School Wide Expectations. Students are reinforced for positive behavior by using PBIS (Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports) through the use of a class and school wide acknowledgment system. Behavior data is monitored monthly by the school-wide Positive Behavior Intervention Team.

At Home

Here are some ideas of how families can support students' success:

- Have your child write for a variety of relevant and engaging purposes (making the grocery list, writing letters or notes to family and friends, draw a picture and write a story to go with it.)
- ✓ Read high interest books with your child each day.
- Ask your child to explain what they are learning in math and practice different strategies for solving problems.
- ✓ Ask your child to retell stories in complete sentences.
- ✓ Reinforce the school expectations at home: Be Respectful, Be Responsible, Be Safe.
- Make sure your child gets plenty of rest. Students between the age of 5-12 need a minimum of 8 hours of sleep each night. Create a nightly bedtime routine.
- ✓ Ensure that your child maintains excellent school attendance.
