# Annual Report of The Citizens' Oversight Committee 2009/2010 School Year

# Purpose

The Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (referred to as "the Committee" or "CBOC" for the remainder of this document) is charged with informing the public concerning the expenditure of bond proceeds of Measure M. The exact details of the purpose of an oversight committee and its duties are specified in the California Constitution (AB 1908), and are summarized in the Committee's bylaws. The bylaws state that, "*The purpose of the Committee as set forth in Prop.* 39 is to inform the public at least annually by issuing a written report concerning the expenditure of bond proceeds from Measure M approved by the voters March 5, 2002." The Committee is required within the annual report to certify, if valid, that Chino Valley Unified School District is in compliance with Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) of the California Constitution.

# **Committee Members and School District Staff**

The Committee is currently comprised of 13 members: Tom Haughey, representing the City of Chino; David Black, representing a taxpayers' organization; Kevin Cisneroz, an at-large member; Edger Gray Jr., representing a senior citizen organization; Jamie Harwood, representing a business organization; Valerie James, as a parent/guardian who is also active in a parent-teacher association; Julie Allen, a parent member; Roman Nava, an at-large member; Mike Kreeger, an at-large member; Bob Basile, an at-large member; Sheila Mautz, representing the City of Ontario; Patti Arlt, representing the Chino Valley Chamber of Commerce; Art Bennett, representing the City of Chino Hills.

Nomination and elections of CBOC officers resulted in Dave Black being voted as Chairperson, Kevin Cisneroz as Vice Chairperson, and Roman Nava as Secretary.

Five positions would become available on June 30, 2010 due to term limits placed within the CBOC bylaws. Three available positions would be for at-large members, one would be for a parent or guardian of a child currently attending District schools, one position would be for City of Ontario. Committee Member Bob Basile moved out of district before his term was completed. Members Julie Allen and Roman Nava were termed out of office. Applications were being accepted until July 12, 2010.

The school district (District) was represented by Assistant Superintendent, Ms. Sandra Chen; Director of Maintenance, Operations and Construction, Mr. Michael Chapko; Director of Planning, Ms. Iris Chu; and Ms. Laurie Trimbach for administrative support.

We would like to thank all exiting Committee members for their dedication and commitment to the District's construction program. Each of them has provided a valuable service to the community.

# **Performance Audits**

Mr. Royce Townsend, Audit Manager at Vavrinek, Trine, Day & Co., LLP, addressed the Committee regarding the Measure M bond performance and financial audits for the District. The audit found no noted issues.

# **Bond Funds**

Ms. Chen distributed to the Committee and reviewed updated Expenditure Reports at the August 24, 2009, November 16, 2009, March 15, 2010, and June 21, 2010 meetings with final figures reflecting the ending date of May 31, 2010. In addition to the bond measure amount of \$150 million, \$10,014,356.76 was earned in interest as of May 31, 2010; \$950,326.03 was transferred from San Bernardino County for construction of county classrooms, bringing the net total to \$160,964,681.99. \$133,106,560.28 has been spent, leaving a cash balance of \$27,858,121.71.

# School Site Visits/Re-Dedications

The CBOC did not visit any school site during this fiscal year. Numerous members of the Committee attended the Don Lugo High School Stadium dedication ceremony Wednesday, March 31, 2010. The public was invited to the ceremony.

# **Communications with the School District**

In October 2009, the Committee approved a motion to provide semi-annual reports to the Board of Education, a May/June summer preview of awarded projects and a September/October review regarding Measure M projects.

# **Construction Update**

Mr. Chapko gave a presentation and construction update at every meeting providing information on the status and progress of projects funded in whole or in part by Measure M funds. The following projects were completed during the 2009/2010 school year:

- Don Lugo High School football stadium and synthetic football field
- Howard Cattle Elementary School parking lot expansion
- Ayala, Chino Hills, Chino High Schools field and track improvements
- Chino High School phase 5 renovation
- Canyon Hills and Townsend Junior High schools portables addition/relocation
- Levi Dickey Elementary School main building modernization

Construction commenced on the following projects during 2009/2010 with completion expected before August 31, 2010:

- Buena Vista High School portable science lab
- Los Serranos, Oak Ridge, and Rolling Ridge Elementary Schools landscaping and slope stabilization
- Glenmeade Elementary and Townsend Junior High schools concrete replacement
- Eagle Canyon, Litel, Oak Ridge, Canyon Hills, and Townsend Junior High, and Don Lugo High School exterior lighting replacement

- Country Springs, Oak Ridge, and Ayala High School HVAC equipment replacement
- Cattle, Dickey, and Chino Valley Learning Academy restroom partition upgrades
- Country Springs Elementary ADA access ramp construction
- Butterfield Ranch, Country Springs, Rolling Ridge Elementary Schools miscellaneous alterations and improvements
- Litel Elementary School and Ayala High School parking lot expansions
- Dickey and Newman Elementary Schools exterior painting
- Butterfield Ranch, Cattle, Eagle Canyon, Litel, Oak Ridge, Rolling Ridge Elementary, and Townsend Junior High School data cabling for new VOIP phone system
- Oak Ridge and Rolling Ridge Elementary skylight replacement
- Canyon Hills and Townsend Junior High School asphalt paving
- Country Springs, Eagle Canyon, Walnut, Canyon Hills and Ayala intercom/PA system replacement
- Chino High School Building L renovation, fencing, and concrete replacement
- Canyon Hills and Townsend library expansions

# CITIZENS' BOND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES June 21, 2010

**Call to Order**: Mr. Dave Black, committee chairman, called the meeting to order at 5:32 p.m.

Members present were Dave Black, Roman Nava, Kevin Cisneroz, Art Bennett, Mike Kreeger, Julie Allen, Valerie James, Jamie Harwood, Ed Gray, Patti Arlt and Sheila Mautz. Sandra Chen, Michael Chapko, Iris Chu, and Laurie Trimbach represented District staff.

Mr. Chapko led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### 1. Public Comment

Stephanie Nelson and Eileen Minton spoke to the committee regarding the need for a pool at Chino Hills High School. Mr. Black and Ms. Chen commented on the tentative timeline for completion of the pool.

#### 2. Approval of Meeting Minutes

Mr. Kreeger moved to approve the minutes from March 15, 2010, Mr. Nava seconded the motion, and all members approved.

#### 3. Annual Report

Mr. Nava agreed to prepare the annual report and send it to Mr. Black for distribution.

#### 4. Expenditure Report, May 31, 2010

The report for expenditures made during the period ending May 31, 2010 (attached), was distributed to committee members and reviewed by Ms. Chen. In addition to the bond measure amount of \$150,000,000.00, \$10,014,356.76 in interest was earned as of May 31, 2010; \$950,326.03 was transferred from San Bernardino County for construction of county classrooms, bringing the net total receipts to \$160,964,681.99. \$133,106,560.28 has been spent, leaving a balance of \$27,858,121.71.

#### 5. <u>Membership Status</u>

Ms. Chen said that several positions will be open on the committee: the parent/guardian of a CVUSD student, three at-large positions, and the City of Ontario appointee. Ms. Allen and Mr. Nava have served two two-year terms and are not eligible for reappointment. Mr. Basile moved out of the area. Mr. Kreeger and Ms. Mautz are eligible to serve one more two-year term. Applications are due to the Office of Communications by July 12<sup>th</sup>.

Ms. Chen thanked Ms. Allen and Mr. Nava for their dedicated service to the District's children with their membership and faithful attendance to committee meetings as well as serving as officers of the committee.

# 6. <u>Construction Update</u>

Mr. Chapko, Director, Maintenance, Operations & Construction, distributed and discussed the Construction Update Overview for June 21, 2010, and the Capital Facilities Program – Summer 2010 spreadsheet (attached).

# 7. Planning Update

Ms Chu, Director, Planning, distributed and discussed the Measure M – Planning Update for June 21, 2010 (attached).

# 8. Member Communications

Mr. Nava said it's been a pleasure and an honor to serve on the committee. Ms. Allen said it's been great to be part of this process and learn how the District spends the Measure M money. She said it's been eye-opening, enlightening, and interesting and she's proud to have been able to serve on the committee for four years.

Mr. Black said he attended the Don Lugo stadium dedication. He observed that the Don Lugo community really came together to support the building of the stadium and they stayed involved until it was completed.

# 9. Other Topics

Mr. Gray said the Chino High tennis courts look like they're done and asked if Measure M money was used. Ms. Chen said the tennis courts were repaired using Capital Facilities/Developer Fee funds. Mr. Gray also asked if Measure M funds would be used for the charter school. Ms. Chen said no Measure M money will be used there. Ms. Arlt asked if the District is getting rebates or up-front funding from the local water districts for the landscaping projects. Mr. Chapko said his department takes advantage of all rebates and funding available from all sources and are looking for cost avoidance in reclaimed water, irrigation controls, waterless urinals and various other areas.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:38 p.m.

Don Lugo HS Stadium

Construction commenced April 20, 2009 with completion expected by March 2010.

#### This project is 100% complete.

Canyon Hills / Townsend JHS Library Expansion Project

Construction commenced at both sites on October 5, 2009 with completion expected by August 31, 2010.

Canyon Hills – Exterior finishes are complete with interior finish work remaining. Interior painting, wall finishes, drop ceiling grid installation and mechanical, electrical, plumbing finishes are in progress. Casework, counter tops and flooring installation to follow. Science room renovation began last week with completion schedule before school starts. Overall, this project is approximately 80% complete.

Townsend – Exterior finishes are complete with interior work remaining. Interior finishes, casework & counter tops and flooring installation is in progress. Overall, this project is approximately 95% complete.

Buena Vista HS Portable Science Lab Project

Construction commenced December 21, 2009 with completion **revised to July 1**, **2010 due to delay of DSA deferred approval for fire sprinkler system.** 

All exterior work is complete. New fire sprinkler system installation is in progress with epoxy flooring to be installed upon completion of fire sprinklers. Overall, this project is approximately 90% complete.

# CITIZENS' BOND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES March 15, 2010

**Call to Order**: Mr. Dave Black, committee chairman, called the meeting to order at 5:32 p.m.

Members present were Dave Black, Roman Nava, Kevin Cisneroz, Mike Kreeger, Julie Allen, Valerie James and Sheila Mautz. Sandra Chen, Michael Chapko, Iris Chu, and Laurie Trimbach represented District staff.

Ms. James led the group in the Pledge of Allegiance.

1. Public Comment

None.

# 2. Approval of Meeting Minutes for November 16, 2009

Mr. Nava moved to approve the minutes from November 16, 2009, Ms. Mautz seconded the motion, and all members approved.

#### 3. Expenditure Report, December 31, 2009

The report for expenditures made in the period ending December 31, 2009, was distributed to committee members and reviewed by Ms. Chen. In addition to the bond measure amount of \$150,000,000.00, \$9,777,123.57 in interest was earned as of September 30, 2009; \$950,326.03 was transferred from San Bernardino County for construction of county classrooms, bringing the net total receipts to \$160,727,448.80. \$128,187,358.06 has been spent, leaving a balance of \$33,540,090.74.

All state matching funds have been received for all eligible projects to date. Applications for state funding for future eligible projects have been submitted, i.e., Briggs campus, and portions of the Glenmeade and Magnolia campuses.

#### 4. <u>Construction Update</u>

Mr. Chapko, Director, Maintenance, Operations & Construction, distributed and discussed the Construction Update Overview for March 15, 2010 (attached). The Don Lugo stadium will be taken to the Board for Notice of Completion on April 1<sup>st</sup>, exactly one year from the date the Board approved the project.

# 5. Planning Update

Ms Chu, Director, Planning, distributed and discussed the Measure M – Planning Update for March 15, 2010 (attached). Ms. Chen reported that many of the listed projects will be bid and completed during summer 2010 on a very aggressive schedule.

Mr. Nava asked what the Ayala parking lot restoration would entail. Mr. Chapko explained that in the northeast corner of the campus where a greenhouse existed previously, a 30-space parking lot will be constructed, along with some "path-of-travel" improvements.

Mr. Kreeger asked about the difference between the original Facilities Assessment Report estimate for Cattle Elementary School of \$1.2 million and the current estimate of \$3.2 million. Ms. Chen explained that the project estimates were prepared back in year 2000 when the FAR was put together. As time passes, each project on the list is reviewed as to its need and validity; some of the project costs have increased and some other projects have dropped off the list because they were determined to be unnecessary.

Mr. Nava asked about the Chino Hills High School athletic facilities listed on the update. It was explained that the only athletic facility still needed on the campus is a swimming pool.

#### 6. Member Communications

Mr. Black said the dedication of the Don Lugo High School stadium will be held March 31 at 6:30 p.m.

Mr. Cisneroz was asked by a community member if Measure M funds can be used to purchase new books for a library. Ms. Chen explained that if it's a brand new library, books are considered furniture and equipment.

Mr. Nava said that March 25<sup>th</sup> is the San Bernardino County State of the County event from 9:00 to 5:00 and will be held at the cultural center at Victoria Gardens.

#### 7. Other Topics

Ms. Chen responded to committee questions that came up during the audit review at the last meeting. The first question was about the entry for \$59,000+ for the purchase of land. The entry was not for purchase of land but it was an expense related to land survey. The information was communicated to the auditor and the mistake was corrected. The second audit question pertained to which employee salaries and benefits are funded by Measure M. Twenty percent of the planning director's salary; and fifty percent of the construction coordinator's salary are funded by Measure M. The last audit question was regarding an expenditure of approximately \$9,700 under equipment replacement. The expenditure was for some HVAC equipment at Chino High School.

Mr. Cisneroz asked if the concerns were addressed regarding the agriculture program at Don Lugo High School by the two gentlemen who attended two COC meetings. Ms. Chen said meetings were held with the principal and the teacher. It was determined that the concerns were of an operational nature having to do with the greenhouses and were a site administration issue and not Measure M related.

The meeting was adjourned at 6.04 p.m.

Don Lugo HS Stadium

Construction commenced April 20, 2009, with completion expected by March 2010.

This project is 99.9% complete with final punch list work underway and 100% completion by March 19. The stadium dedication ceremony and grand opening is scheduled for March 31.

Canyon Hills / Townsend JHS Library Expansion Project

Construction commenced at both sites on October 5, 2009, with completion expected by August 31, 2010.

Canyon Hills – Rough carpentry and structural steel framing is 99% complete. Roofing of new building is underway as are exterior plaster and finishes. Doors, jambs and windows are scheduled for installation and interior finishes are to begin immediately after exterior is "dried in" and building is weather proof. After further discussion, the following dates were determined for the 2010 committee meetings: March 15, June 21, August 16, and November 15. The annual report will be distributed by email for review prior to approval at the August 16<sup>th</sup> meeting. Mr. Bennett suggested changing the meeting start time to 5:30 instead of 5:00. Mr. Cisneroz made the motion, Mr. Bennett seconded, and all were in favor of the meeting dates and time selected.

# 5. <u>Construction Update</u>

Mr. Stachura, Construction Coordinator for Maintenance, Operations, and Construction, distributed and discussed the Construction Update Overview, which includes updates since the November 16, 2009 meeting (attached).

# 6. Planning Update

Members previously requested a cost estimate at the last meeting and Ms. Chu provided a rough estimate.

As of the September expenditure report, there was a cash balance of about \$38 million. From October to December 2009, approximately \$6 million has been spent for the completion of various projects. Another \$3 million is encumbered for the stadium project at Don Lugo High School; approximately \$3 million is set aside for the library projects at Townsend and Canyon Hills and the Buena Vista science lab. The next set of projects ready to bid is estimated at \$500,000 and includes miscellaneous projects at Rolling Ridge, Butterfield Ranch, and Country Springs. The next group of projects still in planning is primarily miscellaneous restroom upgrades, telephone upgrades at school sites, the Ayala parking lot revision and expansion and shade structure, Litel parking lot revision and expansion estimated at \$5.5 million, roughly including soft costs.

From the \$38 million balance in September after all these estimated encumbrances and the actual expenditures, about \$20 million remains. The remaining major projects include the Glenmeade upgrade, Magnolia upgrade, Chino Hills High School athletic/physical education facilities, and the Briggs modernization, as well as adding covered walkways from the main building to relocatable classrooms at various sites.

#### 7. Member Communications

Ms. Harwood said there's a spaghetti dinner at the Chino Senior Center going on today and requested the members stop by and buy dinner. Mr. Cisneroz said Kiwanis Bunco is coming up February 18<sup>th</sup> and proceeds benefit the Chino Neighborhood House held at the Senior Center. Ms. Mautz said the City of Ontario State of City address will be held on March 3<sup>rd</sup> at the Ontario Convention Center.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:56 p.m.

# **BUILDING FUND NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JUNE 30, 2009**

#### NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies of the Chino Valley Unified School District Building Fund conform to accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America as prescribed by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) and the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants. The Chino Valley Unified School District Building Fund accounts for financial transactions in accordance with the policies and procedures of the California School Accounting Manual.

#### A. Financial Reporting Entity

The financial statements include only the Building Fund (Measure M) of the Chino Valley Unified School District. This fund was established to account for the expenditures of general obligation bonds issued under the General Obligation Bonds Election of 2002. These financial statements are not intended to present fairly the financial position and results of operations of the Chino Valley Unified School District in compliance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

#### B. Fund Accounting

The operations of the Building Fund (Measure M) are accounted for in a separate set of self-balancing accounts that comprise its assets, liabilities, fund balance, revenues, and expenditures. Resources are allocated to and accounted for in the fund based upon the purpose for which they are to be spent and the means by which spending activities are controlled.

#### C. Basis of Accounting

The Building Fund (Measure M) is accounted for using a flow of current financial resources measurement focus and the modified accrual basis of accounting. With this measurement focus, only current assets and current liabilities generally are included on the balance sheet. The statement of revenues, expenditures, and changes in fund balance reports on the sources (revenues and other financing sources) and uses (expenditures and other financing uses) of current financial resources.

#### D. Investments

Investments held at June 30, 2009, with original maturities greater than one year are stated at fair value. Fair value is estimated based on quoted market prices at year-end. All investments not required to be reported at fair value are stated at cost or amortized cost.

#### E. Interfund Balances

On fund financial statements, receivables and payables resulting from short-term interfund loans are classified as "interfund receivables/payables".

#### B. Policies and Practices

The District is authorized under California Government Code to make direct investments in local agency bonds, notes, or warrants within the State; U.S. Treasury instruments; registered State warrants or treasury notes; securities of the U.S. Government, or its agencies; bankers acceptances; commercial paper; certificates of deposit placed with commercial banks and/or savings and loan companies; repurchase or reverse repurchase agreements; medium term corporate notes; shares of beneficial interest issued by diversified management companies, certificates of participation, obligations with first priority security; and collateralized mortgage obligations.

#### C. Investment in County Treasury

The District is considered to be an involuntary participant in an external investment pool as the District is required to deposit all receipts and collections of monies with their County Treasurer (*Education Code* Section 41001). The fair value of the District's investment in the pool is reported in the accounting financial statements at amounts based upon the District's pro-rata share of the fair value provided by the County Treasurer for the entire portfolio (in relation to the amortized cost of that portfolio). The balance available for withdrawal is based on the accounting records maintained by the County Treasurer, which is recorded on the amortized cost basis.

#### F. Credit Risk

Credit risk is the risk that an issuer of an investment will not fulfill its obligation to the holder of the investment. This is measured by the assignment of a rating by a nationally recognized statistical rating organization. The District's investments in the county pool are not required to be rated, nor has it been rated as of June 30, 2009.

# THE BONDS

#### AUTHORITY FOR ISSUANCE

The Election of 2002 Bonds are issued pursuant to the Constitution and laws of the State of California (the "State"), including the provisions of Chapters 1 and 1.5 of Part 10 of the California Education Code, and other applicable provisions of law. The Election of 2002 Bonds are authorized to be issued by a resolution adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County (the "Resolution"), pursuant to a request of the District made by a resolution, adopted by the Board of Education of the District on December 6, 2001.

The District received authorization at an election held on March 5, 2002, to issue bonds of the District in an aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$150 million to finance specific construction and renovation projects approved by eligible voters within the District. The measure required approval by at least 55 percent of the votes cast by eligible voters within the District.

#### **PURPOSE OF ISSUE**

"To relieve severe overcrowding, improve safety for children, repair/renovate local schools, shall Chino Valley Unified School District acquire, construct, and improve school sites and facilities, obtain eligibility for State funding, add classrooms, build schools, repair roofs, eliminate asbestos/other safety hazards, upgrade electricity, plumbing, heating/cooling systems, improve security and provide for technology, issue \$150 million of bonds, at legal interest rates, with independent Citizens Oversight and annual audit of expenditures, with no money for administrators' salaries."

Don Lugo HS Stadium

Construction commenced April 20, 2009 with completion expected by March 2010.

The synthetic football field turf has been installed and is complete. The synthetic running track has been surfaced and striped and is complete. The home and visitor bleachers, press box and elevator are complete. Buildings A & B are complete. The scoreboard has been installed and is operational. Remaining site work concrete, fencing, softball field renovation and landscape planting is currently underway. Overall, the project is approximately 90% complete.

Canyon Hills / Townsend JHS Library Expansion Project

Construction commenced at both sites on October 5, 2009 with completion expected by August 31, 2010.

Canyon Hills – Underground utilities are complete and the footings / concrete building pads have been poured. Rough carpentry and structural steel framing has begun. During the winter break, ADA improvements were completed in the front of the school. Overall, this project is approximately 30% complete.

Townsend – Underground utilities and concrete access upgrades were completed over the winter break. Rough framing / carpentry is complete and ready for stacked stone veneer. Building mechanical, electrical and plumbing work is in progress with some interior drywall complete. Interior library A/V room is complete with school occupancy and use in the next few weeks. Overall, this project is approximately 50% complete.

Buena Vista HS Portable Science Lab Project

Construction commenced December 21, 2009 with completion expected by March, 2010.

Underground utilities (fire line, sewer, storm drain, water, and electric) are in progress with some site concrete complete and building pad preparation is underway. Overall, this project is approximately 25% complete with completion expected by March 2010.

Ms. James made a motion to approve the October 5<sup>th</sup> minutes, Mr. Kreeger seconded the motion, and all approved. Mr. Cisneroz, Mr. Gray, and Mr. Haughey abstained as they didn't attend the meeting.

# 3. <u>Meeting Dates for 2010</u>

Mr. Black suggested scheduling one meeting in January, and schedule the rest of the meetings for 2010 after the Board of Education meeting schedule has been approved on December 10<sup>th</sup>. After discussion, the committee scheduled the next meeting on January 25, 2010.

# 4. Expenditure Report for period ending September 30, 2009

The expenditure report for expenditures made in the period ending September 30, 2009, was distributed to committee members and reviewed by Ms. Chen. In addition to the bond measure amount of \$150,000,000.00, \$9,590,775.20 was earned in interest as of June 30, 2009, \$950,326.03 was transferred from San Bernardino County for construction of county classrooms, bringing the net total receipts to \$160,541,100.43. \$122,050,930.81 has been spent, leaving a balance of \$38,490,169.62

# 5. <u>Construction Update</u>

Mr. Chapko, Director of Maintenance, Operations, and Construction, distributed and discussed the Construction Update Overview, which includes updates since the October 5<sup>th</sup> meeting (attached).

# 6. Planning Update

Ms. Chu, Director of Planning, distributed and discussed the Planning Updates for November 16, 2009 (attached). Mr. Haughey asked what the approximate cost of the planned projects is. Ms. Chen explained some of the estimated costs and said the committee would receive a cost update at the next meeting.

# 7. Member Communications

Mr. Black introduced the District Superintendent, Mr. Wayne Joseph and said Mr. Joseph attended the meeting in order to address a concern Mr. Kreeger brought up at the previous meeting. Mr. Kreeger explained his concern about spending Measure M funds on schools that were subsequently closed and the lack of communication between the district and the committee on the expenditure of those funds. Mr. Joseph said the District was facing a large deficit and needed to make some difficult decisions regarding budget cuts in a very short amount of time. The school closures could not have been foreseen at the time the modernization and Measure M projects were being planned and implemented. He said he will do everything possible to communicate with the committee as long as he's in a position to do so.

Mr. Black said that the Principal-for-a-Day event will be held on November 18<sup>th</sup> and encouraged anyone who is able to participate. Mr. Nava said County Supervisor Ovitt had a dedication of the sidewalks at Dickson Elementary School. He also said the sidewalks by Walnut are in need of work and asked if that information can be brought to the attention of the city. Mr. Haughey said the City of Chino's tree lighting ceremony will take place at 6:00 p.m. on December 1<sup>st</sup>, and the Christmas parade will begin at 8:00 a.m. on December 12<sup>th</sup>. He said that corporate sponsors are welcome.

Ms. Mautz wished everyone a Merry Christmas, Happy New Year, and very safe and sane holiday season.

### 8. Other Topics

Ms. Chen thanked the members of the committee who took the time to participate on the District's Facilities Master Plan. The Board approved the 20-year vision for the District's facilities, and the plan is available for viewing on the website.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:51 p.m.

Don Lugo HS Stadium

Construction commenced April 20, 2009 with completion expected by March 2010.

The synthetic football field turf has been installed and is 100% complete. Running track is paved with synthetic surface installation to be scheduled. Home and visitor bleacher erection is underway, elevator installation is on going, and interior finish work is underway in buildings A & B. Site fencing is underway as is concrete sidewalk work and lighting. Score board installation will take place within the next week. Project is approximately 65% complete.

Canyon Hills / Townsend JHS Library Expansion Project

Chino High School

a. Final / Phase 5 (buildings 1m, n, & q, & F/A in math wing portables will be 100% complete by August 28, 2009. Project close out in progress.

Levi Dickey Elementary School

a. Main building modernization project will be 100% complete by August 28, 2009 with some remaining miscellaneous site work to be completed by mid-September 2009. New parking lot is 100% complete; new playground equipment is 100% complete.

Howard Cattle Elementary School (Parking Lot Expansion)

a. 100% complete and occupied. Project close out in progress.

Ayala HS, Chino Hills HS, Chino HS (Field & Track Improvements)

a. All three sites are 100% complete with closeout in progress. Fields and tracks will be turned over to the school sites for their use on August 31, 2009.

Don Lugo HS Stadium

a. Construction commenced April 20 with completion expected by March 2010. Underground sewer, electrical and field cooling systems are in progress.
 Buildings A & B underground utilities are 100% complete, masonry block being placed. Project is 15% complete overall.

Canyon Hills / Townsend JHS Portables Addition/Relocation Project

a. 4 new portables at each site have been placed and will be ready for occupancy by August 28, 2009. Underground fire line and hydrant work is in progress with completion by August 28, 2009.

Canyon Hills / Townsend JHS Library Expansion Project

a. This project has been advertised for bids and the job walk was held on August 19, 2009. The bid opening is scheduled for September 3, 2009 with board approval anticipated on September 17, 2009.
