

Homework

Homework is assigned Monday-Thursday

I go over homework at the end of each day with students and we fill out our agendas together.

Students are responsible for writing down their homework in their agenda, getting it signed each night, and returning it to school the next day.

Students will be notified of upcoming quizzes and tests and are encouraged to study.

If your child is struggling with homework and has been working on it for 30 minutes, please draw a line where they left off and sign.



Homework

Math homework is assigned most nights to reinforce the concepts learned in class that day. (Typically not assigned on test days)

A minimum of 20 minutes of reading is assigned each night. 2 passing AR quizzes are due at the end of each month to ensure that students are keeping up with their reading.

Students are expected to read a variety of books (**both fiction and informational**) around their AR level.

A passing AR quiz score is 70% or higher.

Students are given time in class to take AR quizzes!



Curriculum

 Daily assignments will be assigned and submitted in person, through Google Classroom, ConnectED Wonders (ELA), Savvas EnVision (Math), and Twig (Science). Students and parents can access all of these at home using ClassLink.

• Students are expected to complete each task in entirety, take their time, and put in their best effort.

• All work must be completed and submitted by the due date. Students are expected to communicate with the teacher if there is any issue.

 All work must be the student's own. Academic dishonesty (cheating, copying, etc.) will result in consequences consistent with district guidelines.

Attendance

 Please ensure your child is feeling well each day to avoid spreading illness at school.

Board Policy requires a parent verification of each absence within 5 school days of the student's return to school. On the sixth day, the absence becomes unverified and cannot be changed. State law requires that each absence be cleared.

• Please **contact the office** at (909) 591-1336 to report absences. Contacting the teacher about an absence is not the same as clearing the absence with the office.

 Students will be given a few days to make up work (depending on how long they were absent for)

CVUSD Grading

- 4 Excelling: Students at the Excelling level of performance are consistently performing at grade level, can demonstrate independence, and can extend the grade level standards, when applicable, expected at this point of the school year. (90-100%)
- 3 Achieving: Students at the Achieving level of performance demonstrate an **adequate understanding** of and ability to apply skills needed to meet grade level standards at this point of the school year. (70-89%)
- 2 Progressing: Students at the Progressing level of performance are **partially meeting** the grade level standards expected at this point of the school year. **(60-69%)**
- 1 Beginning/Standard Not Met: Students at the Beginning/Standard Not Met level are **not yet meeting** grade level standards expected at this point of the school year. (0-59%)



Grades

- Assessments will be taken on paper and on the computer.
 - Paper tests will be sent home. Digital tests can be found on Google Classroom.
- □ Please use Aeries gradebook to find final grades (1,2,3,4) for each assessment in all subject areas.
- Grades are posted within a week of the given assessment.
- Students are also graded on their work habits, responsibility and integrity, and 21st century skills

Report Cards

The school year is divided into trimesters.

Students will receive an official report card at the end of each.

Students will also receive a 6-week progress report during the first trimester. You should expect this progress report after the sixth or seventh week of school.

If you do not receive one of these reports, please contact the office.



Chromebooks

- Each student has a Chromebook checked out to them for classroom use. They are responsible for keeping it in good condition and using it properly.
- 4th graders can take
 Chromebooks home. The charger should stay home all year.
- Personal headphones should be sent and kept in school in a labeled bag for use in the classroom.





DEVICE PROTECTION PLAN

Protect your device!

The District Plan covers accidental damage to student Chromebooks or Windows laptops and is designed to limit a CVUSD family's financial liability for any damages as described below.

COVERAGE

Accidental Damage: Pays for accidental damage caused by liquid spills, drops, or any other unintentional event.

Theft: Pays for loss due to theft; the claim requires a filed police report.

Fire: Pays for damage due to fire; the claim requires a filed police report.

Device will be repaired or replaced: At the discretion of the Chino Valley Unified School District, the student's device will be repaired or replaced.

PROGRAM FEE/COVERAGE OPTIONS OFFERED/PAYMENTS

Device Protection Plan:

- Non-refundable fee: \$40 for the current school year.
- Coverage: Repair/Replacement of school issued device throughout the current school year.
 Coverage is per student.

Per Incident Fee:

- \$50 fee per incident. Paid at each incident.
- · Coverage: Repair/Replacement of school issued device for each incident.

Payments:

 Payments can be submitted by cash or check at your student's school site or electronically by visiting www.myschoolbucks.com.

EFFECTIVE COVERAGE/EXPIRATION DATES

Effective Date: Based on the receipt of payment and the completed Device Protection Plan agreement. The process must be initiated at the beginning of the current school year or during the enrollment period of July 1, 2024, through August 31, 2024. It cannot be applied retroactively.

Expiration Date: Last day of applicable school year.

Reporting: Student must report issues to the designated staff member in a timely manner.



EXCLUSIONS

Intentional Damage: The student will be responsible for the full amount of the repair/replacement for intentional acts to the student's device or the device of any other student. This includes throwing, kicking, or other purposeful acts.


Cosmetic: CVUSD *will not* replace a device for purely cosmetic issues that do not affect the functionality of the device.

Misuse: "Jailbreaking" or otherwise voiding the warranty by altering the device.




