Description of Course - This course is designed for the student who is interested in the competitive speech program. Class activities include participation in the speaking events available at the competitive level (Debate, Persuasive Speaking, Expository Speaking, Extemporaneous Speaking, Group Discussion, and Oral Interpretation of Literature). There is continued stress upon principles of organization, methods of support through argument and example, and appropriate language (word usage). Classes represent their schools at speech tournaments within California and the Citrus Belt Speech Region, and at speech events sponsored by local service groups.

Rationale for Course – Competitive speech is similar to drama and athletics, in that students require class time to hone skills through coaching and additional instruction. This course would also provide opportunities for students to build on interests and skills learned in the junior high debate program.
