WHAT DEFINES US HELPING OUR PEOPLE EVERYDAY (HOPE)

The HOPE Program strives to identify and remove barriers that could keep children and youth from doing their best in school. The family unit can be strengthened and positively impacted when providing support and connections to BOTH District AND community resources.



FAMILY RESOURCE CENTERS (FRCS)

Why are FRCs important? Imagine moving to the area but not being able to understand the language or facing a family crisis with limited resources. Comprehensive family-support programs are needed more than ever before. We continue to see the negative effects of housing instability, the lack of basic needs, mental and physical health challenges, and more. FRCs provide the platform to connect with students and parents either at a school site or at a community location. Working in partnership, schools and FRCs can get to the root of a student's struggle to promote personal and academic growth.

HOPE FRCs strive to create a welcoming environment and improve family engagement via 10 centers and satellite locations within CVUSD.

INNOVATIVE PRACTICES

CVUSD was a recipient of the California Department of Education (CDE) Homeless Innovative Program (HIP) grant for 2022-2024! The newly released HOPE Toolkit promotes the integration of city, county, district, and community partnerships to form systemic alliances of support for students and families.




FAMILY IMPACT
