said Captain of Chino Girls Water Polo. This being another issue this team has had to face, they are continuing to fight for every game leading up to the end of the season. ICE Raids Spark Fear and Outrage

On January 7, 2025, Border Patrol conducted unannounced raids in Kern County and Fresno County California. Seventy eight undocumented residents were arrested at their place of work. Multiple people said that they were scared to go back to work, refuse to send their children to school, and did not want to run grocery errands.

Hundreds of people gathered up and down the Central Valley in Bakersfield and Fresno for peaceful protests. They used signs and posters to show their support. The streets were flooded with flags of Mexico, people riding bikes with the Mexico flag on them, and people in their cars driving by, honking their horns waving flags and putting signs out the windows.

Immigrant rights advocates have hosted "Know Your Rights" forums to help people further understand what they can do. People were given resources, advice from attorneys, legal counsel, community experts, and other organizations.

Wildfires Devastate LA Region

There have been multiples fires that have started within Los Angeles County with winds picking up constantly, and fires are becoming harder to control day by day. As of January 15, 2025, three fires were still active and destroying everything in their path named the Palisades Fire, Eaton Fire, and Hurst Fire.

Investigators were currently working to try and figure out if the fires were started by arsonists, or by accident. There have been many videos circulating on the internet of people starting fires in certain areas of California.

The Los Angeles Fire Department worked hard to contain these fires as well as help as many people as possible. Multiple firefighters of the LAFD tried to save people's important belongings such as photo albums and other things that seem to be sentimental. Govenor Nelson advised neighboring states and countries to have 16,000 individuals such as firefighters, highway patrol officers, California National Guard Service members, and transportation teams to help the LAFD.

The Palisades fire erupted the morning on Jan. 7th in pacific palisade, a Los Angeles neighborhood east of Malibu, as a brush fire. The blaze continued to grow to more than 23,713 acres by Sunday night.

At some point there were close to over 200,000 people under evacuation orders as firefighters tried to battle back and restrain the fires. Later on, in the morning of January 7th, the number had reduced to around 88,000 with another 84,800 in evacuation warning zones throughout Los Angeles County. The fires have

demolished entire neighborhoods and blocks, leaving an unknown number of people homeless.

The Eaton fire started on January 7 as well, caused by blowing winds from Santa Ana and spreading throughout the Pasadena area. It has grown to become over 14,117 acres, causing the tragic destruction of 2,722 structures, and contributing to the loss of 15 lives. The wildfire has grown to 35% contained due to the hard work and dedication of the LA County Fire Department.

The Hurst fire also started on the 7th, the cause is said to be under investigation, as some speculate that the flames were caused by homeless people, while others disagree. The area affected was the Sylmar area, with a grand total of 799 acres being engulfed as the surrounding area is currently at 98% containment with great signs of success in containing the flames.

Popular Social Media App Ban Causes Confusion

The popular social media app TikTok was temporarily banned on January 19 leaving people distraught. The ban was due to con-

cerns of data privacy and national security. The Federal Government had already prohibited TikTok on any government devices. government officials are concerned about potential surveillance. They are afraid TikTok's owner company, ByteDance might share user data with the Chinese government.

Byte dance has responded to the banning efforts by stating that they prioritize user data security and do not share data with the Chinese government. ByteDance argues that the ban is unfair and violates the First Amendment free speech protections.

TikTok has faced previous talk of a banning starting with the initial ban attempted in 2020 which ended in the States Army and Navy banning TikTok on government devices. Former president Donald Trump also tried banning TikTok that same year which was later revoked by President Biden's administrations.

This most recent ban is due to the US House of Representatives

passing the protecting Americans from foreign adversary-controlled applications act in 2024 which bans operations relating to TikTok unless ByteDance sells the app.

On January 18th, a day before the initial ban, users received a notification informing them that the app was to be temporarily shut down unless there was an agreement to keep it online.

Fortunately, 12 hours later, users received another notification informing them that they app was back due to the President administration putting it back for users.

Although, during the ban, users who deleted the app were not able to retrieve it again from the app store. Only users who kept the app on their device were able to use the app again.





looking for new members for our Theatre Company. All new students are encouraged to audition as we have a no cut policy."



honor him and his legacy that has shaped America through the generations.


Aviation Industry Faces Scrutiny Amidst Growing Challenges

Beginning this new year, the world's aviation industry continues to face difficulties concerning shortages of labor and the maintenance of plane parts that have begun to result in delayed flights. Airlines are stressed about the reliability and sustainability of the aircraft models they have, such as with the Boeing 737 Max series that was reported to have a worsened performance after the COVID-19 pandemic that caused workers to be laid off, along with the steps that aircraft companies are hesitantly taking towards decarbonizing air travel.

The absence of so many industry professionals due to strikes and slow deliveries for replacement parts has made the traveling public worry about the safety of their flights, forcing airlines to ground portions of their fleets due to engine problems being found in newer planes and holding onto older planes longer than expected. Maintenance workers are now tasked with servicing an ever-growing number of aging engines while newer models arrive for their first overhauls.

One company that was found to be at fault for such actions is the aircraft company, Boeing, with it having fallen into trouble after an incident that occurred in January of last year, when a door plug had not been properly secured during production of a Boeing 737 Max 9, and blew off during an Alaska Airlines flight. This event has left the company to meet demands for an improved quality of its planes and to reduce the production of the 737 Max jets.

There also stands the question of environmental sustainability with aircraft emissions contributing the most to global carbon dioxide output, and as the demand for air travel rises, so does the concern over the industry’s part in climate change. Many airlines have already begun making some strides toward sustainable air travel by developing fuel-efficient planes and utilizing biofuel, efforts that people say are insufficient in the ever-growing mound of environmental challenges. For now, the future of the aviation industry looks rough as it comes under fire from all sides and struggles to find a way to make it out without losing the trust of the public.


