#### COURSE DESCRIPTION

The purpose of this class is to provide students with the opportunity to acquire a general knowledge of European history (1450-present) as it is taught at the introductory level in most colleges and universities. Knowledge of the political events will be balanced by familiarity with social and cultural history. Each student is preparing himself/herself to take the A.P. European History examination. If successful, students may receive credit or advanced standing in history at the college or university of their choice. Within a chronological framework the following topics will be covered:

\*The Middle Ages and the Renaissance

\*The Reformation and Wars of Religion

\*Politics, Culture and Philosophy of the 16th and 17th centuries

\*Eastern and Western Europe & The Old Regime

\*Enlightenment, Revolution and the Age of Napoleon

\*Isms, The 1st Industrial Revolution & the Revolutions of 1848

\*The Consolidation of Nation-States

\*Europe 1871-1920

\*Europe 1920-1945

\*Europe 1945 to the Present

The course will include a great deal of reading in both primary and secondary materials. Our basic textbook is Spielvogel, <u>Western Civilization</u>. Students are required to keep a three ring binder to help prepare them for the Advanced Placement Test.

# **GRADING POLICY**

All of your work has a percentage value. The following scale will apply to this course:

Tests (Essay, DBQ, Short Answers and Multiple Choice) = 45%

Projects = 25%

Homework = 20%

Quizzes = 10%
