COURSE TITLE:

Clothing and Textiles II

DESCRIPTION:

Clothing and Textiles II is a course designed to increase and expand the basic knowledge and skills covered in Clothing and Textiles I. It includes wise selection, use and care of synthetic and natural fabrics.

This course will help students develop advanced skills in clothing construction using knits and stretch fabrics.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

The student will:

1. Show that the proper care of clothing will preserve the appearance and extend the life of clothing items;
2. Master skills in advanced construction techniques with synthetic fabrics.

One semester
