Description of Course - This course is designed to empower students with social tools which are necessary for success in a diverse, democratic society. This course will emphasize personal responsibility, civic duty, and the value of a common culture/shared heritage. Students will gain an understanding of how stereotypes, prejudice, discrimination, racism and conflict affect the path of our society. The strategies used will promote positive interaction among students, encouraging critical thinking and empathy through co-operative learning, roleplaying, problem solving, and analysis of literature/media. Knowledge gained will promote intergroup understanding and foster student success within the school environment preparing students to live and work in a multi-faceted society.

Rationale for Course - Today's youth need to develop personal and group interaction skills to be able to successfully resolve conflict and accept others. Students are given an arena where discussions of respect and personal convictions can lead to the recognition of stereotypes, prejudice, and personal bias. This will facilitate listening to other's perspectives, understanding, and creating a sense of school community.

Standard 1 - Self Inventory

- 1.1 Objective: Students will make a detailed inventory of themselves.
 - 1.1.1 Performance Indicator: Students will recognize personal likes and dislikes.
 - 1.1.2 Performance Indicator: Students will identify personal goals.

 - 1.1.4 Performance Indicator: Students will understand their responsibilities as members of a school community.

- 3.1 Objective: Students will study the detrimental effects of bullying and construct a positive plan to turn those behaviors around.

 - 3.1.2 Performance Indicator: Students will evaluate prejudice, scapegoating, and discrimination in our society.
 - 3.1.3 Performance Indicator: Students will recognize racism and sexism.
 - 3.1.4 Performance Indicator: Students will devise a plan to stop bullying.

- 4.1 Objective: Students will investigate formats for effective communication.
