INTEGRATED MATH 3 HONORS

CLASS EXPECTATIONS AND GRADING POLICY

This course is California Common Core State Standards based. Standards for this course have been set forth by The Department of Education, State of California. Students will be responsible for mathematical content and standards in prerequisite courses and/or previous semesters. All students and parents are responsible to ensure that the prerequisite courses were taken and passed.

The prerequisites for this course are an A or B+ in both semesters of Integrated Math 1 and Integrated Math 2 Honors at Ayala High School or an equivalent course. This course is more challenging and has higher expectations than a regular Integrated Math 3 class and is designed to support and prepare students to take AP Calculus AB next year.

It is critical that each student is a self-directed learner; does all homework problems and reviews notes every night.

MATERIALS

The following items are suggested for class daily:

1. Binder or folder to be used solely as a notebook for this class
2. Filler graph and lined paper for homework
3. Pencil
4. Highlighter
5. Eraser
6. Ruler
7. Scientific Calculator

NOTEBOOK

At the end of every unit your notebook will be collected, and your notes will be given points based on completion. Notes handouts must be filled in during lessons and stored in your notebook, by unit and section. Each day needs to be dated and the title highlighted.

HOMEWORK & CLASSWORK

Homework will be assigned daily and checked for completeness at the start of the next class period. Assignments need to be stored in order, in your class notebook. All homework assignments will be posted online in Google Classroom. **Assignments must be labeled with assignment numbers; problems must be written out and all work shown. No work = No credit!** Incomplete assignments will not earn credit but can be completed and submitted late at the end of the unit for half credit. Late work, and absent work due to excused absences and field trips can also be submitted for credit at the end of the unit. Assignments that are late without an excused reason will receive half credit. Classwork assignments will be given periodically throughout the unit and turned in the day they are assigned. If a student is absent, it is their responsibility to look at Google Classroom and check in

with their classmates to find out about and make up what they missed. Homework, classwork, and notes will together comprise 25% of the overall grade.

ASSESSMENT

Student's progress will be evaluated through comprehensive assessments such as standards-based tests, CVUSD benchmark exams, quizzes, final exam, and/or projects. At the end of each semester there will be a comprehensive final on all material covered. After the assessment has been graded, it will be returned to the student to review in class. Once a graded assessment has left the classroom, no adjustments to the grade will be allowed. It is in the student's best interest to be present on the day of the assessment. If a student is absent on the day of the assessment, a make-up assessment will be taken on the day the student returns to school. It is the student's responsibility to request the make-up assessment upon their return to class. If a student fails to take a make-up assessment, a score of zero will be recorded for that assessment. Assessments will comprise 75% of the overall grade. If a student is absent on the day an assessment is passed back and reviewed, it is their responsibility to request the assessment and ask any questions when they return. There will be no re-take assessments.

PARTICIPATION

Active participation in class is a requirement and will be assessed in citizenship grades. To be an active participant in class, students will be asked to answer questions, demonstrate knowledge, and work in groups. Students must also have all supplies in class and demonstrate good citizenship by following all class and school rules.

ACADEMIC HONESTY

Academic cheating will result in a score of ZERO on the assignment, or assessment. Any talking or communicating during an assessment is considered cheating. Also, having any unauthorized materials out or present during an assessment is considered cheating. This includes but is not limited to all personal electronic devices.

CLASSROOM RULES

It is the right of each student to be provided with an atmosphere in which they may learn. It is expected that students will obey all class and school rules. This includes not eating or drinking in class (other than water). To ensure a proper learning environment all electronic devices must be turned off and put away at the start of class. All students will be expected to follow school and district rules along with the following classroom specific rules:

1. Treat everyone and the classroom supplies/environment with respect.
2. No inappropriate language or innuendo.
3. Be ready/prepared to learn.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

A variety of corrective measures will be used to maintain a successful learning environment. Inappropriate behavior will result in one or more of the following.

1. Speak with the teacher after class.
2. Home contact
3. Referral to the office
4. Suspension from the class

I have availability before school and at lunch to provide extra tutoring, but arrangements need to be made in advance.

ORGANIZATION AND CLEANLINESS OF THE CLASSROOM

Students will be expected to take proper care of supplies loaned to them/available to them. Students will also be expected to pick up after themselves.

RESTROOM POLICY

Students can use the restroom as needed one at a time by asking and receiving a pass/signature from the teacher.

GRADING SCALE

The following percentage grading scale applies.

A grade of "D" or better is required to earn credit for the course. Citizenship grades are based on attendance, classroom behavior, and adherence to the school and district rules. Work habit grades are based on homework completion and positive participation in class.

ONLINE GRADE POSTING

Grades will be posted and updated on Aeries about once a week.

GOOGLE CLASSROOM

Assignments and announcements will be posted in Google Classroom daily. Students can use Google Classroom to mark assignments as done, keep track of their progress and store digital copies of assignments but assignments will need to be turned in in-person. When an assignment is incomplete no credit will initially be given.

RENAISSANCE CARD REWARDS

Students can use one oops pass and one homework pass per semester. Both an oops pass and homework pass will be accepted to earn full credit on one late assignment that is done completely. The card must be shown and signed off prior to the end of finals day each semester.
