REHUGO PROJECT

In order to become more informed citizens and to gather evidence for your argument essays, you will complete a REHUGO portfolio. Each of the sections will be graded separately. The type of evidence you are collecting is exactly the type of information you will need to knowledgeably defend your position in an argument essay on the AP exam, so the work product must be thorough and meet the standards of the AP exam readers – relevant, accurate, and sufficient (in other words, don't bring in evidence from unreliable sources or that deal with trivial matters).

ORGANIZATION:

You will need a folder with six tabbed dividers. Label the tabs in the following order: R, E, H, U, G, O.

*The first page of your folder will be the REHUGO chart. You will complete this chart as you enter your research material in the folder.

| <p>ONE BOOK -</p> <p>This must be nonfiction (memoirs are nonfiction), and must be something that you read for this assignment, not a book you have read in the past. It should deal with an issue common today (relevant).</p> <p>.....</p> <p><i>You will choose one book to read with your <u>group</u>. Make a reading schedule with your group to ensure sufficient progress. Once you have completed the book, you will film or record your group having a "book club" discussion. This could be in the format of a video or podcast. You will need to have discussion questions developed beforehand. Your recording should be between 5-10 min.</i></p> | <p>ONE MOVIE ONE MUSIC ALBUM ONE MUSEUM VISIT -</p> <p>The movie should be a documentary or film that deals with a significant event or issue.</p> <p>The music album can be any genre of music and demonstrate a theme.</p> <p>The museum visit should be an art, history or science museum. Select one exhibit to discuss. If you are not able to visit a museum IRL, virtual museum tours are acceptable.</p> <p>.....</p> <p><i>For each piece of entertainment, you must write a review. Look at online reviews for formatting/structuring ideas, but your review must be original.</i></p> | <p>ONE PIVOTAL HISTORICAL EVENT WITHIN THE LAST 100 YEARS -</p> <p>Make sure that the event that you are discussing is something of significance on a large scale.</p> <p>.....</p> <p><i>You play the teacher/professor here. With your <u>group</u>, you will present one pivotal historical event to the class in the format of a lecture. Your presentation could be in the form of a PPT, a prezi, etc.</i></p> | <p>TWO UNIVERSAL TRUTHS -</p> <p>Find two truths that appear as either common maxims or quotes from any reading.</p> <p>.....</p> <p><i>Creatively and symbolically display the maxim or quote.</i></p> | <p>ONE COMMUNITY SERVICE IDEA -</p> <p>Identify a need in our society (this can be local to our School population, state wide, national or global).</p> <p>.....</p> <p><i>Demonstrate evidence of this need through news articles that address the problem or with a written transcript of a personal interview with someone who is an expert on the topic (an expert is typically a degreed individual, not a peer).</i></p> <p><i>With your <u>group</u>, create a proposal or pitch for your idea in the format of a brochure, poster, or other product that might be appropriate for proposing a plan.</i></p> | <p>THREE OPINIONS ON CURRENT EVENTS (AT LEAST ONE ON CURRENT NATIONAL GOVERNMENT) -</p> <p>These may be written based on the news events discussed in class or issues and events that you find in your own reading of the news.</p> <p>.....</p> <p><i>Print 3 articles. Write a 2 paragraph response for each article: 1 rhetorical precis paragraph and 1 argument paragraph response that demonstrates your own opinion on the topic.</i></p> |
